**Item 1
Paul Haynes
Downtown
Heritage Plaques**

Paul Haynes of Haynes Marketing Communications Company gave a presentation regarding the Downtown Streetscape Project Phase II. The project is a partnership between the Downtown BIA, Downtown Village Development Corporation and Greater Sudbury Development Corporation. The project was approved in principle by Council last year. City Staff are developing an implementation strategy for this phase of the project, which is expected to be presented to Council in the Fall of 2009. Two pilot demonstration projects are planned for the Durham/Larch and Durham/Cedar intersections this summer. New street lights, benches, bicycle racks and other amenities will be introduced at these intersections. It has been suggested that heritage plaques form part of the proposed improvements. The Committee's assistance is being sought with respect to text for the two plaques. The Committee expressed its support for the Downtown Streetscape Project and offered to assist by reviewing the proposed plaque text when developed.
