Rainbow Routes
Heritage Hikes
Project

P. Moores, Project Coordinator with Rainbow Routes, provided a verbal overview of the History Hikes Project. The History Hikes Project was initiated to coincide with the City's 125th Anniversary. The project has an urban focus and provides historical walking tours of five areas, including: Downtown Sudbury; McNaughton Subdivision; Flour Mill; Capreol; and Copper Cliff. Three tools are used to assist walkers, including:

- Pamphlets - contains maps, photos and written descriptions and are available in English and French, in both hard and electronic formats.
- Interpretative Signage - installed in key locations (as noted in the pamphlet maps) in each area.
- [murmur]: signage installed in key locations (as noted in the pamphlet maps). Signage prompts users to dial into a number and listen to recordings that tell a story about a particular area. The same recordings are available at sudbury.murmur.info for those who do not have cell phones. Each recording is approximately 1.5 to 4 minutes in length.

The committee discussed the project and noted that it could also be used:

- to share stories and memories relating to local parks in the area (e.g. Ridgecrest Rally);
- as part of a broader, city-wide local marker program;
- to highlight designated and listed built heritage resources.

St. Joseph. The school hoped to expand west and on to the existing soccer field. The existing soccer field would be relocated south of the school and onto the former convent lands resulting in demolishing of the convent.

The Board noted that the property was not a recognized heritage property when purchased and expressed concerns regarding the cost to maintain the building. The Board noted that the building is not required to meet the Board's long term objectives and expressed concerns regarding the feasibility and cost of adaptively reusing the building. The Board and Committee discussed the adaptive re-use potential of the building. The Committee requested to meet with the Board and its architects to further explore potential adaptive reuse options. The Board agreed to consider this request at their next meeting.
