Elgin Street Greenway

FA2016-53 McIntosh/Cormier: Whereas the Elgin Street Greenway is a signature project of the Greater Sudbury Downtown Master Plan, a designated priority of Council's Strategic Plan, Greater Together, and

Whereas the Greenway is highlighted in the future vision of Greater Sudbury presented in From the Ground Up, the city's economic development strategic plan; and

Whereas a final design and budget for the Greenway project is not available for inclusion in the 2017 Municipal Budget but is expected to be presented to Council in the first quarter of 2017.

Therefore be it resolved that the City of Greater Sudbury directs staff to bring forward, at the same time as the Greenway final design, an implementation and construction schedule for the project which includes project initiation in 2017 and project completion in 2020; and

Further that, at the same meeting, staff bring forward a financial plan to fully fund the Greenway project; and

Further, that the City of Greater Sudbury requests that the Greater Sudbury Development

Finally, that staff be directed to initiate applications to the provincial and federal governments for financial contributions to the Greenway project.
