Item R-3 Walford Road -Parking Restrictions Report dated September 9, 2015 from the General Manager of Infrastructure Services regarding Walford Road - Parking Restrictions.

The following recommendation was presented:

OP2015-37 Vagnini/Landry-Altmann: THAT the City of Greater Sudbury prohibits parking on the north side of Walford Road from 275 metres east of Paris Street to Nepahwin Avenue;

AND THAT parking be prohibited on the south side of Walford Road from 275 metres east of Paris Street to Nepahwin Avenue, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., each day;

AND THAT a by-law be passed by City Council to amend Traffic and Parking By-Law 2010-1 in the City of Greater Sudbury to implement the recommended changes all in accordance with the report from the General Manager of Infrastructure Services dated September 9, 2015.

QUESTION PERIOD

Line Painting

Councillor Kirwan asked if road lines would be re-painted this year.

The Director of Roads & Transportation Services responded that the lines would be repainted and a small tender is being put out to facilitate the work.

<u>Signage</u>

Councillor Reynolds requested signage at the corner of Attlee and Lasalle to indicate Attlee Avenue.

The General Manager of Infrastructure Services responded that regulatory signs are the responsibility of Infrastructure Services and that he or the Director of Roads & Transportation Services could look into the matter.

Speed Bump Policy

Councillor Landry-Altmann asked if the City's speed bump policy is still in effect and what process is required to have speed bumps installed on area roads.

The Director of Roads & Transportation Services noted that speed tables are approved for local roads only and residents can apply to the traffic department to be included on the traffic calming project list. He explained streets are ranked in terms of speed and traffic volume and the work goes ahead on the highest ranked roads first.
