QUESTION PERIOD AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Pot Hole Filling Process

Councillor Kirwan requested information regarding the city's strategy and process for filling pot holes.

The director of roads and transportation services advised that city crews are the first choice to fill pot holes. When city crews are on other jobs or in other situations as needed, contract partners are relied upon. The ideal time to complete the filling of pot holes is during the summer months when the temperature is more favourable. The priority is to look to main arterial roads but the City does try to address all pot holes.

Line Painting

Councillor Reynolds noted there are no lines remaining on The Kingsway and asked when it is expected they will be repainted.

The director of roads and transportation services advised that legislation has recently changed regarding paint products and the water based paint required doesn't last as long as oil products that can no longer be used. Recently, crews attempted to spray temporary paint lines, but the lines lasted less than 48 hours. He noted the traffic paint truck is just back from winter maintenance and once temperatures warm it will be out to put a temporary line down. Staff continues to review different products for this use.

Handi Transit Report

Councillor Kirwan requested clarification of the status of a report and any appeals regarding Handi Transit.

The General Manager of Infrastructure Services, advised there is no specific date to present the report to council as of yet, but the report is expected within the next couple months. He noted any citizens that currently have appeals pending continue to be allowed to use the system until their appeal is heard.
