PETITION

TO THE CITY OF GREATER SUDBURY

We, the residents of Mountain, Harvey, Leslie, and Myles Streets, support business in our community. However, recent developments in our neighborhood forbode cause for concern

We are petitioning the City of Greater Sudbury to enforce bylaws and traffic violations, as they relate to *Intelcom*, an Amazon delivery service, leasing space in a commercial building, adjacent to Harvey Street. Open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, including holidays, the growing amount of transport trucks and *Intelcom* delivery vans travelling to and from the site have made our roads and neighborhood unsafe.

Transport trucks arrive after midnight daily -- as many as four -- speeding, often ignoring stop signs to arrive at the site; *Intelcom* delivery vans seen throughout the day speeding, ignoring stop signs, blasting music, and carrying on loud Bluetooth conversations.

The Management of *Intelcom* refuses to heed to any concerns or issues, arbitrarily ignoring bylaws, traffic violations, and community standards.

We are requesting *Intelcom* Sudbury relocate to an area more conducive to their business practices, as their current practices are detrimental to the quality of life and safety of our neighborhood.

We deserve safety and respect in our historically quiet neighborhood.
