#### **Declaration of Respondent**

I, the undersigned respondent, am Bill Leduc, Councillor of Ward 11.

I was a candidate during the 2022 Election Period.

This is my response to the Application for an Election Compliance Audit of my Candidate Campaign Finances as submitted by Anastasia Rioux on April 4, 2023.

#### **Introductory Statements**

- 1. According to Section 88.33 (1) of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, "An elector who is entitled to vote in an election and believes on reasonable grounds that a candidate has contravened a provision of this Act relating to election campaign finances may apply for a compliance audit of the candidate's election campaign finances."
- 2. All applications for a compliance audit must be reviewed by the Clerk, who can only reject an application based on limited reasons outlined in By-law 2023-1 A By-law of the City of Greater Sudbury Election Compliance Audit Committee for the 2022 To 2026 Term to Establish Procedural Rules For The Committee.

The reasons for rejecting an application are outlined in Section 9 of the By-law:

- 9.1 Where an Application is submitted before or after the timelines provided in the MEA, an Application shall be rejected by the Clerk.
- 9.2 Where the Clerk determines that the Applicant is not a qualified elector entitled to make an Application in accordance with the MEA, the Clerk shall reject the Application.
- 9.3 Where the Applicant has not provided written submissions setting out the reasons for their belief that a Candidate or Registered Third Party has contravened the MEA relating to election campaign finances, the Application shall be rejected by the Clerk.
- 9.4 Where the Applicant has not complied with the requirements of Article 6.03, the Application shall be rejected by the Clerk.
- 3. Therefore, when an application that meets the basic requirements of Section 9 is received by the Clerk, it must be submitted to the Election Compliance Audit Committee (ECAC) for consideration. The only "test" for whether the application is submitted is that the applicant "believes that a candidate for Mayor, Councillor, Rainbow District School Board Trustee, Sudbury Catholic District School Board Trustee or Registered Third Party has broken campaign finance rules." The Clerk cannot apply any additional test to determine the merits of the application.
- 4. It is clearly outlined on the City web site that "The ECAC only considers alleged violations of the Act pertaining to election campaign finances and does not consider any other complaints of alleged candidate wrong-doing or contraventions of the Act."

Therefore, once the Clerk forwards an application that has been received and is not rejected for any of the reasons out lined in Section 9, the ECAC must schedule a hearing in order to consider written and oral submissions from the applicant and the candidate to determine if there is reasonable grounds to grant the

application.

- 5. If the application is granted, the ECAC must appoint an auditor licensed under the Public Accounting Act, 2004 to conduct a compliance audit of the candidate's election campaign finances.
- 6. The ECAC will then receive and consider the auditor's report and decide whether to commence a legal proceeding against the candidate for an apparent contravention.
- 7. With respect to the Application for a Compliance Audit being presented by the Applicant, Anastasia Rioux, which is being considered at the ECAC hearing of April 27, 2023, Ms. Rioux claims to have reasonable grounds for believing that I, as a candidate for City Councillor of Ward 11, contravened the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 relating to my election campaign finances. It is now up to the ECAC to consider the written and oral submissions of the applicant as well as myself and determine if the application should be granted.
- 8. In order for the ECAC to grant the application, the members of the ECAC must be convinced that there is sufficient objective compelling evidence to support the applicant's allegation that there has been a contravention of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 with respect to my election campaign finances.

The test for granting the application that must be applied by the members of the ECAC is much higher than simply "believing" that there are reasonable grounds.

The applicant has claimed to have reasonable grounds, but it is up to the applicant to provide evidentiary "proof" to the ECAC that there are reasonable grounds for the application.

The ECAC must also arrive at the conclusion that there are reasonable grounds to grant the application. The ECAC must consider the evidence presented by the applicant as well as the evidence presented by myself, the candidate, in my defense. After evaluating all of the submissions, the ECAC be convinced that there is sufficient objective, compelling evidence to support the claim in order to grant the application and refer the matter to an auditor licensed under the Public Accounting Act, 2004 to conduct a compliance audit of my election campaign finances.

In the absence of objective compelling evidence sufficient that there are reasonable grounds for the ECAC to believe that I have contravened a provision of this Act relating to election campaign finances to grant the application, the application must be rejected by the ECAC. It must be pointed out once again that the test to be applied by the ECAC must be at a higher level than that used by the applicant in making her request.

9. For the record, my financial statement is already accompanied by an auditor's report.

Mr. Eric Moles, Licence Number 1-9236, is a Chartered Professional Accountant whose objective was to obtain reasonable assurance about whether my financial statement as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that included his opinion. Mr. Moles also pointed out that "reasonable assurance" is a high level of assurance.

Mr. Mole wrote the following opinion:

I have audited the accompanying Financial Statement - Auditor's Report Candidate - Form 4 for the William Leduc Election Campaign for the campaign period May 2, 2022 to December 31, 2022 for the City of Greater Sudbury municipal election held on October 24, 2022 prepared in accordance with Section 88 of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

In my opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses of William Leduc for the campaign period ending December 31,2022 in accordance with the financial reporting provisions prescribed in the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and guidance issued by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

#### Statements of Fact in Response to the Application

- 10. The Grandparents Day, which is the material event referred to in the application, was hosted on private property known as the Westmount Retirement Residence at 599 William Avenue in Sudbury. The event was sponsored by the Ward 11 Minnow Lake Community Action Network with funds from the Ward 11 HCl and contributions from area associations and individuals. This information was clearly conveyed in posters announcing the event. It is also recorded in the HCl records for 2022 that the funds were provided to the Ward 11 CAN.
- 11. For the record, there is no such thing as a City Councillor's "slush fund" or "councillor fund". The HCI fund is administered by staff and considers applications for grants or capital funding from community organizations.
- 12. The application contains no objective, compelling evidence that any of the city election guidelines were violated by myself or anyone associated with my campaign before, during or after the event. My car was not parked on the property. There has not been any evidence presented that would prove that I erected any signs or handed out any material during the event. There are witnesses who would testify that I did not conduct any campaign activities during the event.
- 13. This was nothing more than a public event hosted on private property and was attended by a number of members of City Council as well as a number of candidates for election. My attendance at the event was in my capacity as Councillor of Ward 11. So too was the attendance of Mayor Brian Bigger, who attended the event to read a declaration. I have evidence to support this position.
- 14. It is important to note that legislation prohibits the city from contributing corporate resources to a candidate during an election, therefore, if the event was deemed to be a campaign event, the EMS vehicles would not have been able to attend. I asked the EMS to bring the ambulance and fire equipment to the event and it was clearly understood that this request was being made in my capacity as Councillor of Ward 11 on behalf of the host and sponsor. Evidence can be provided to support this position.
- 15. There is no evidence that I used any City Technology for any Campaign Activity, either during the Grandparent's Day or at any other time during the campaign period.
- 16. The applicant has stated that her written submission outlining the reasons why she felt that I contravened the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 is a copy of a letter that she sent to the City Clerk's Office on September 12, 2022.
- 17. Despite the fact that her letter is Dated April 4, 2023 and it begins with the heading, "Dear Compliance Audit Committee & the City of Greater Sudbury Clerk", there is no other mention of any of the sections of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 relating to campaign finances that the applicant believes have been violated. And yet there are clear instructions on Form 4 for the applicant to include the relevant section(s) of the Act that she believes to have been violated. There is no reference to the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.
- 18. I have reason to believe that the applicant did not even read my financial statement. On her Form 4 Application, she was required to include the date that my Financial Statement was filed. She wrote "March 31, 2023 (as mentioned by City Clerk)" as the date that I filed my statements. In fact, my Financial Statement clearly indicates

that it was filed on March 23, 2023. It would be reasonable to expect that an applicant submitting an application for a compliance audit would at the very least have read my Financial Statement before submitting the application to determine if I have violated the Act relating to campaign finances. Yet, she admits that her submission was written on September 12, 2022.

- 19. It is reasonable to believe that the applicant intended the letter on September 12, 2022, to be a complaint to the Integrity Commissioner over alleged violations of the City election guidelines. In fact, she brings up the city election guidelines in her written submission and even identifies specific sections of the "City of Greater Sudbury Policy Regarding the Use of Municipal Resources During an Election Campaign Period." The ECAC considers complaints of violations of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, related to campaign finances.
- 20. Another reason to believe that the applicant intended the letter on September 12, 2022 to be a complaint to the Integrity Commissioner is evidenced in her very last sentence, "It is now time for the City Clerk and Integrity Commissioner to intervene and ask some tough questions regarding his finances." It would be reasonable to assume, based on this conclusion, that the letter was being directed to the Integrity Commissioner and not the Election Compliance Audit Committee.
- 21. The City web site clearly states the role of the ECAC on the page outlining the procedure for anyone to apply for an Election Compliance Audit. "The ECAC only considers alleged violations of the Act pertaining to election campaign finances and does not consider any other complaints of alleged candidate wrong-doing or contraventions of the Act."
- 22. Based on the evidence presented above, it is reasonable to conclude that the applicant knew or ought to have known that the complaints which were contained in her letter fell under the jurisdiction of the Integrity Commissioner, who is responsible for investigating complaints of wrong doing involving City Councillors for violating election guidelines and other municipal policies and by-laws. The applicant makes specific references to the "City of Greater Sudbury Policy Regarding the Use of Municipal Resources During an Election Campaign Period" policy" in her written submission, but there is no mention of the Municipal Election Act, 1996, which is what the ECAC has jurisdiction over with respect to election finances.

#### Conclusion

23. Whereas the applicant has failed to provide objective, compelling evidence which would be sufficient for the ECAC to believe that there are reasonable grounds that I have contravened a provision of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, relating to election campaign finances, I would ask the Election Compliance Audit Committee to reject the application.

#### **Report Summary**

This report provides information regarding the financial particulars of each Ward's Healthy Community Initiative Fund allocation for the period of January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, in accordance with By-law 2018-129.

### Relationship to the Strategic Plan, Health Impact Assessment and Community Energy & Emissions Plan (CEEP)

This report refers to the Quality of Life priority area as identified in the Strategic Plan and aligns with the Population Health Priorities including Resiliency, Families, Mental health, "Play" Opportunities, Age-Friendly Strategy, Compassionate City, and Healthy Streets. The Healthy Community Initiative Fund supports community-based projects and initiatives that are affordable and promote inclusiveness for the benefit of citizens.

#### **Financial Implications**

There are no financial implications associated with this report.

#### **Background**

By-law 2018-129 requires Council be provided with semiannual reports identifying the financial particulars of the Healthy Community Initiative (HCI) Fund allocations by ward.

A total of \$500,000 was allocated to the HCI Fund in the 2022 Budget. There were no funds transferred from the 2022 allocation to the HCI Reserve Fund as it had achieved its maximum level of \$24,000 in accordance with HCI Fund Policy under By-law 2018-129. The remaining funds were divided between the capital projects stream and the grants stream; 75% and 25%, respectively. A total of \$99,394.00 was deducted from the capital stream and committed towards the Playground Revitalization initiative. The remaining grant and capital balances were then evenly distributed between the 12 Wards.

Appendix A - Healthy Community Initiative Fund — 2022 Annual Report provides detailed information relating to carry-forward and year-to-date fund balances, fund allocations, donation revenues, as well as specifics of expenditures and of unexpended commitments for the period of January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022. Ward fund balances in this report may differ from those identified in the routine HCI funding requests for Council approval reports presented throughout the year.

The legend within each of the ward specific reports reflects the eligible expenditure categories as well as the Population Health Priorities as outlined in the HCI Fund Policy (By-law 2018-129).

#### 2022 Fund Outcome Measures

Funds allocated through the capital stream support City-owned assets and funds allocated through the grant stream support community-led initiatives such as events and programs.

#### Capital Stream

A total of 21 HCl capital funding applications were approved in 2022 for a combined value of \$450,712. Approved funds were allocated as follows:

- 17% toward playgrounds
- 16% toward outdoor rinks/courts
- 7% toward community gardens
- 5% toward new infrastructure (shed, picnic tables)
- 27% toward facility upgrades
- 27% toward parks, trails, and community beautification
- 1% toward art projects

#### Grant Stream

A total of 37 HCl grant requests were approved in 2022 for a combined value of \$62,250. The grants were allocated as follows:

- 63% toward events
- 29% toward programs/small initiatives
- 1% toward fundraising initiatives
- 6% toward art programs
- 1% toward volunteer appreciation

#### **Outstanding HCI Capital Applications**

Previously approved HCI Capital Projects that are beyond the 24-month period will be prioritized and incorporated with staff workplans for completion within the 2023 construction season. Projects are expected to be completed within original project budgets and contingencies. Some previous HCI approvals are dependent on applicants securing additional third-party funding. These projects will only advance once applicants have secured all project funding required.

#### **Next Steps**

A 2023 semiannual report of ward specific HCI Fund financials will be presented for Council's information in fall 2023.

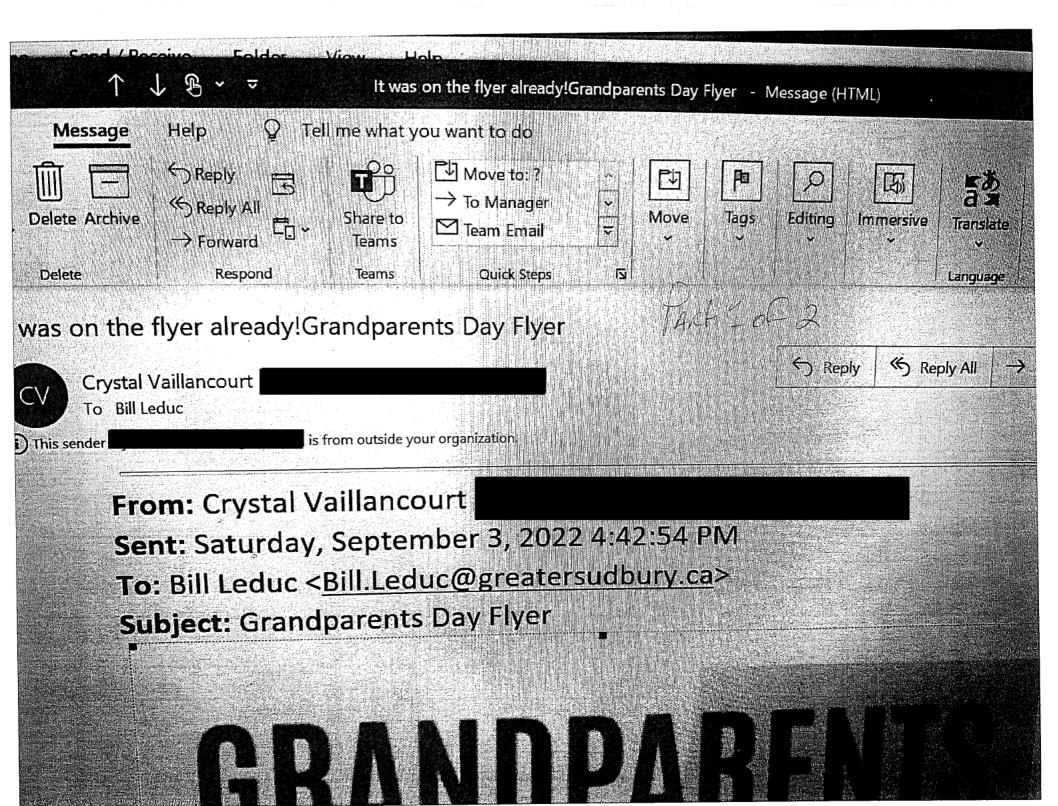

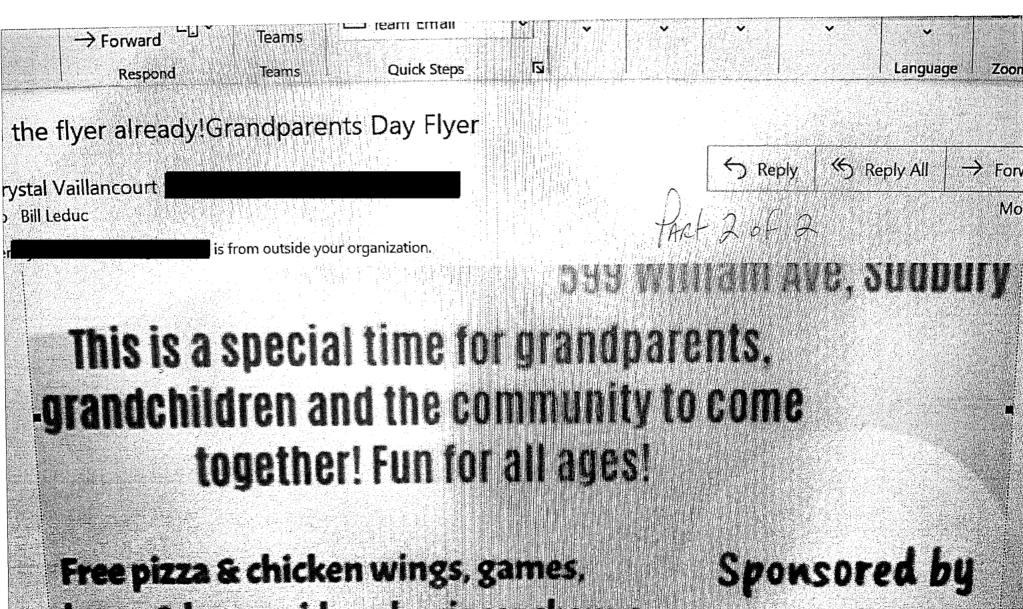
