Report Summary

This report seeks direction from City Council regarding the appointment of an Integrity Commissioner for the City of Greater Sudbury.

Resolution

THAT the City of Greater Sudbury direct staff to prepare a by-law appointing Boghosian & Allen LLP as the Integrity Commissioner for the City of Greater Sudbury as described in the report of the General Manager of Corporate Services presented at the City Council Meeting on June 13, 2023.

Relationship to the Strategic Plan, Health Impact Assessment and Community Energy & Emissions Plan (CEEP)

This report refers to operational matters and has no direct connection to the Strategic Plan and Community Energy and Emissions Plan.

Financial Implications

The anticipated cost for the services of the Integrity Commissioner is funded within existing approved budgets.

Background

The *Municipal Act, 2001*, was amended in 2018 to provide that, effective March 1, 2019, all municipalities in the province are required to appoint an Integrity Commissioner responsible for providing the following in relation to members of municipal Councils and local boards:

- The application of the code of conduct for members;
- The application of any procedures, rules and policies governing the ethical behaviour of members;
- The application of provisions of the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act to members;

- Requests from members for advice respecting a member's obligations under the code of conduct;
- Requests from members of council and of local boards for advice respecting their obligations under a procedure, rule or policy governing the ethical behaviour of members;
- Requests from members of council and of local boards for advice respecting their obligations under the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act, and,
- Educating members, the municipality and the public about the municipality's codes of conduct for members of council and members of local boards and about the *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act*.

The City appointed Mr. Robert Swayze as Integrity Commissioner for the City of Greater Sudbury in 2018 and the term of his appointment expires on July 22, 2023. In anticipation of the expiry, staff prepared and issued a request for proposals ("RFP") in April. The City's RFP was communicated to numerous firms in the province already providing integrity commissioner services to other municipalities. The closing date for submissions was May 17, 2023 and the City received three proposals from the following firms:

- ADR Chambers Inc.
- Boghosian + Allen LLP
- Sage Analytics Inc.

The proposals were evaluated by a group comprised of the Deputy City Solicitor, a Legislative Compliance Co-ordinator and the City Solicitor and Clerk. The evaluation process consisted of a number of different steps. The evaluation team reviewed and scored the written proposals using evaluation criteria based on the following principles:

- 1. Previous municipal governance, procedural and/or ethics experience;
- 2. Knowledge of municipal government and an understanding of Council and/or local board operations and policies;
- 3. Knowledge of municipal law as relates to the accountability and transparency provisions in the Act;
- 4. Ability to provide services in a flexible and as needed manner;
- 5. Ability to develop trust and maintain credibility with City Council, staff and media;
- 6. Ability to maintain confidentiality, independence and confidentiality;
- 7. Experience receiving and managing complaints and conducting fair and impartial investigations which include the use of alternative dispute resolution processes
- 8. Experience drafting written advice and reports for individual and public review;
- 9. Ability to provide written advice and develop and deliver educational services; and
- 10. Efficient use of City funds.

This first stage of the evaluation included scoring of qualifications and experience, the proponent's proposed workplan and financial proposal. Financial proposals were to include an annual retainer fee (if applicable), rates or costs for travel to Sudbury and hourly rates for persons that will be delivering services based on an estimated amount of 200 hours of work for the first year of the contract.

The next stage of the evaluation consisted of an interview and, based on the scoring of the initial evaluation, two of the proponents proceeded to this step being ADR Chambers Inc. and Boghosian + Allen LLP.

The interview process comprised of a presentation delivered by proponents on a topic related to Integrity Commissioner services followed by a number of questions from the evaluation team regarding the proponent's experience in delivering similar services and how they propose to manage the services.

Based on the cumulative score from the evaluation process, Boghosian + Allen LLP was identified as the successful proponent subject to City Council approving the appointment of Mr. Boghosian as the City of Greater Sudbury's Integrity Commissioner and execution of the service provider agreement.

Mr. Boghosian is the managing partner of Boghosian + Allen LLP and he has practiced in the area of municipal law for over 30 years. He has acted for municipalities big and small, elected officials and municipal staff in numerous legal proceedings in different municipal topics. He has a high level of familiarity with all aspects of municipal law and is generally recognized as an expert practitioner in the field.

He is a regular speaker at conferences on municipal issues and, more specifically, on ethical, conflict of interest and code of conduct issues. He has co-authored The Law of Municipal Liability in Canada and teaches courses on municipal government and municipal liability at Osgoode Hall Law School.

Mr. Boghosian is currently the Integrity Commissioner for the Town of Pelham and the Town of Fort Frances. In addition, he has frequently acted in code of conduct investigations and advised on *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act* matters for municipalities.

Mr. Boghosian will provide cost effectiveness in delivering his services by using his firm's resources at lower hourly rates where appropriate. In addition, services will be delivered through electronic means wherever possible thus avoiding costs from unnecessary travel. A copy of Mr. Boghosian's curriculum vitae is included as Appendix "A" to this report.

NEXT STEPS

Subject to the adoption of the recommendation above, staff will present a by-law to appoint Boghosian + Allen LLP on an upcoming agenda and will finalize the service provider agreement for the services to be effective commencing July 23, 2023 for a term of five years.
