What are Development Charges?

 Funding tool that helps assign the costs of public infrastructure to the people that benefit from them

 Pays for new infrastructure (e.g. roads, pipes) and facilities (e.g. ambulance stations) to maintain service levels

 Principle is "growth pays for growth" – existing taxpayers do not subsidize new development








Development Charge Act Requirements

- DCs established by by-law
- Maximum life of DC by-law is 10 years after the day it comes into force
 - City's current by-law expires June 30, 2024




- Undertake a background study
- Hold at least one public meeting
- Appeals adjudicated at OLT






Development Charges Study Process


Population Forecasts to 2051: City of Greater Sudbury










Residential DC Comparison (per SDU)








Non-Industrial DC Comparison (per sq.ft.)

DC Legislation is Still Evolving

Bills 108, 138, 197, 23...and counting

- Bill 23, More Homes Built Fast Act
 - Exemptions: existing rentals, residential intensification, non-profit housing
 - Discounts: purpose built rentals
 - Phase-in: all DCs over 5 years
- Bill 185, Cutting Red Tape to Build More Homes Act
 - Repeal of phase-in
 - Reintroduction of growth-related studies as eligible cost
 - Affordable housing exemptions (June 1)



Proposed DC By-law Changes

1. Legislative conformity

2. DC policies

- 10-year redevelopment credit for vacant and derelict buildings
- Green building DC reductions / exemptions:
 - 25% LEED
 - 50% LEED Silver
 - 75% LEED Gold
 - 100% LEED Platinum
- Brownfield redevelopment exemptions
- Minor changes to Nodes and Corridors exempt areas
- Changes to small residential unit requirements
- Sunsetting of locational-based exemptions after 5 years
- Separate by-laws for different services
