<p>DRAINAGE REFEREE: Any owner of land or public utility can file an appeal to the Drainage Referee on the grounds that the report does not comply with the Act, within 40 days of the mailing. [S. 47(1)]</p>	<p>COURT OF REVISION Any owner of land who has assessment complaints can appeal to the COR; appeals must be filed at least 10 days before the COR [S. 52]</p>	<p>DRAINAGE TRIBUNAL: Any owner of land, public utility or Conservation Authority may file an appeal to the Drainage Tribunal on technical grounds, within 40 days of the mailing. [S. 48(1) and S. 49]</p>
<p>After the COR decision is given, appellants can appeal this decision to the Tribunal within 21 days [S.54(1)]</p>	<p>The COR must be held between 20 and 30 days after the notice is sent [S. 46(3)]</p>	<p>If an appeal is filed, the Tribunal will hear the appeal and decide.</p>
<p>If an appeal is filed, a Referee hearing is held and a decision is made.</p>	<p>If an appeal is filed, a Tribunal hearing is held and a decision is made</p>	<p>After all appeals have been heard and dealt with, Council can give third reading to the by-law. [S. 58(1)]</p>
<p>Construction may begin 10 days after third reading, subject to Section 58(1) and 58(2).</p>	<p>REPORT ADOPTION STAGE</p>
