Background

Dillon Consulting has been retained for the purpose of updating the Solid Waste Management Master Plan. The plan development is divided into four phases:

- 1) Assess the current state
- 2) Envision the future state
- 3) Determine how to move from the current to future state – Options, goals and performance measurement
- 4) Development of a 10-year Solid Waste Management Master Plan

The report attached as Appendix A supports Dillon Consulting’s presentation and provides a detailed summary of the Phase 1 assessment of the current state of the City’s solid waste management system which also includes an analysis of key trends, legislation, best practices and public consultation.
