- Over 200 Written Submissions Received






#### What questions does Phase 1 address?


- How will our population, employment and land use needs grow and change over the next 20 years?

## Population, Housing and Employment Projections





#### Source Water Protection



- OP policies must conform to the Source Protection Plan
- Affects development and public works within vulnerable areas
- Stormwater; water takings







#### Lake Water Quality Management



- Site plan control on all shoreline lots
- 20m vegetation buffers on lakes
- No new unserviced lots on nutrient rich lakes or lake trout lakes over threshold





#### Natural Heritage



- Minor house-keeping edits (e.g., adjacent lands definitions)
- OP policies conform to the PPS
- Importance of preconsultation

### Climate Change Adaptation






- New to the Provincial Policy Statement 2014
