- Failure of blueberry crop in summer of 2015, increased incidence of human / bear interactions
- Higher volume of calls to MNRF, City of Greater Sudbury, Greater Sudbury Police Service and media
- Required coordinated effort / response
- Public expectations from government agencies vs. appropriate response
