By-law 2016-57

A by-law of the City of Greater Sudbury to Authorize Grants from the Healthy Community Initiative Fund Made in the Fourth Quarter of 2015

Whereas the Council of the City of Greater Sudbury allocated from the capital envelope, in the year 2015, sums for expenditures from the Healthy Community Initiative Fund;

And Whereas, pursuant to Section 107 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S. 0. 2001 c. 25, Council may pass by-laws for grants to certain bodies for purposes in the interest of the municipality;

And Whereas Council of the City of Greater Sudbury wishes to authorize the monies expended by way of grant to the community associations for Healthy Community Initiatives from the Healthy Community Initiatives Fund during the fourth quarter of 2015 and not previously approved;

Now therefore the Council of the City of Greater Sudbury hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. Council of the City of Greater Sudbury hereby approves the payments from the Healthy Community Initiatives Fund made or to be made, by way of grant to or for the benefit of the organizations identified in Column A, for the purpose identified in Column B and in the amount in Column C, all as set out in the chart on Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this By-law. These are one time grants from funds allocated for the 2015 calendar year.
- 2. Any advances made by the Chief Financial Officer / Treasurer from the Citizen and Leisure Services sub-envelope for Healthy Community Initiatives in accordance with Schedule "A" upon the written request of the Executive Assistant to Councillors or such person as she may have authorized to request funds in her place and stead are hereby approved.
- 3. This By-law shall come into full force and effect upon passage.
