## Council's Key Pillars

- Growth and economic development
- Responsive, fiscally prudent, open governance
- Quality of life and place
- Sustainable infrastructure



## **Core Municipal Services**

### \$518 million operating budget

- A 3.9% increase in the property tax levy
  - 1.3% Provincially mandated plus decrease in OMPF
  - 0.5% Outside boards (Police, SDHU, NDCA)
  - 0.3% Policy driven inflation on capital envelopes
  - $\geq$  1.8% Increase for existing municipal services

2016 Capital Budget → \$106 Million

```




3.9% Base Municipal Tax Increase






#### Revenue (in millions):






#### Composition of the 2016 Base Budget (in millions):





## **Assessment Growth**







### **Major Drivers of Levy Increase Changes:**

Tax Levy Increases		% Impact on Levy
Decline in Provincial Grants (OMPF)	\$2,700,000	1.2%
Increase from Outside Boards	\$1,200,000	0.5%
Housing Services	\$880,000	0.4%
Environmental Services	\$820,000	0.4%
Increase in Capital	\$730,000	0.3%
Fleet Repairs and Maintenance	\$380,000	0.2%
Other Net Increases (including contractual obligations)	\$2,100,000	0.9%
Total	\$8,810,000	3.9%





# Benchmarking and Key Performance Indicators

- Withdrew from OMBI in 2015
- Analyze Key Performance Indicators
- Perform environmental scans to determine best practices
- Plan for implementation of results



# **Asset Management Plans** and Capital Needs

- Roads capital requirement \$700 M
- Water/Wasterwater capital requirement -\$345 M
- Throne Speech referenced municipal infrastructure funding
- Consider capital levy of .5%, 1% and 2% to close the infrastructure gap



# **Examples of Capital Projects**

Major Road Reconstruction (Lorne Street, Skead Road, Long Lake Road and asphalt patches)	\$12.9M
Various Watermain Replacements & Lining	\$8.2M
M.R. 35 Rehabilitation (Notre Dame to Hwy 144)	\$5.5M
T.D.S. Courtyard (including waterproofing)	\$4.8M
Transit Bus Replacements	\$2.0M
Adanac Ski Lift Replacement	\$1.7M
Snow Plows	\$1.0M






## **Allocation of 2016 Taxes**
