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Training Section

- Chief Training Officer
- Training Officers 3; Accommodated Training Officer 1
- ► Station Captains deliver core fire training in stations
- ► Career Firefighters augment specific training programs
- ► Tech Rescue Instructors Hired on as-needed basis







National Fire Protection Association Standards

North American Standard in the Fire Service (Career/Volunteer)

Establishes prerequisites and the minimum job performance requirements for fire disciplines, Fire Prevention, and the Fire Code







Technical Rescue Training

- Emergency First Response (Medical Aid)
- Vehicle Extrication
- Rope
- Confined Space
- Watercraft/Ice/Swiftwater Rescue









Core Fire Training Programs

CAREER STREAM

- Career Academy 9 Weeks
- Captain Training
- Daily Core Training led by Captain
 - Training meets Council approved service levels
 - CTO establishes NFPA compliant curriculum
 - ▶ CTO sets training calendar

VOLUNTEER STREAM

- ▶ Volunteer Academy 40 hours
- ► Live Fire Annual Session
- Weekly Training in Stations led by Captain
 - ▶ CTO establishes curriculum
 - ▶ CTO sets training calendar
- Captain Training Program (New)
- Annual Physical Testing



Officer Development

- Captains frontline supervision of firefighters
- Collective Agreements have differing language
- ► New process in 2018 for Volunteer Captains
- Historically, little development once promoted





Influences on Fire Training

- Service Levels Dictate annual training requirements
- ► Fire Service Budget to support training activities
- National Fire Protection Association Standards
- Collective Agreements (CLAC 72 hours annual training)
- Occupational Health & Safety Act (OHSA)
- Section 21 Guidance Notes
- Career Training done on shift
- Volunteer availability training weekday evenings
- Training Officer Capacity
