Background

- Existing By-law
 - Defines 'ATV'
 - Allows ATV on certain streets, depending on season:
 - Between April 1 and November 30
 - Between December 1 and March 31



Existing definition of 'ATV'

- 4 wheels
- Steering handlebars
- One seat for driver only
- No passengers





Public Consultation and General Feedback

New Provincial Regulation

- Took effect July 1, 2015
- Enabling legislation Opt-in
- Allows additional types of ATVs

Summary

- Existing by-law regulates ATV use on public streets
- July 1, 2015 New enabling legislation that allows more types of ATVs



Recommendation

THAT the City of Greater Sudbury repeals and replaces By-law 2013-131, being a By-law to Permit and Regulate the Operation of All-terrain Vehicles on Certain Highways, in order to allow multi-purpose off-highway utility vehicles, recreational off-highway vehicles, and all-terrain vehicles to use the shoulder of certain highways.
