Summary of NEW cycling facilities installed in 2019 In 2019, the City of Greater Sudbury installed 7.2 centreline km of cycling infrastructure:

- York Street from Paris Street to Regent Street (Bike Lanes)
- Elm Street from Ethelbert Street to Regent Street (Bike Lanes)
- Auger Avenue from LaSalle Boulevard to Falconbridge Road (Edgeline)
- North Side of Dominion Drive from MR 80 to Elmview (Multiuse Trail)






Summary of NEW sidewalk installed in 2019

In 2019, the City of Greater Sudbury installed 1.2 km of new sidewalk:

- York Street from Paris Street to Regent Street
- Regent Street from Long lake Road to Old Burwash Road
- Second Avenue from Bancroft Drive to Approx. 50 m South (east side)
