Key Facts

- Mandatory municipal service
- Active cemeteries produce revenue
- 9 cemeteries are active, 16 are full
- One cemetery is privately owned (Parklawn)
- 950 burials per year
- 70 % cremation vs 55% 15 years ago
- \$7 million care and maintenance fund
- No tax levy support for current operations (rare in Ontario)



Beautification Program

- Introduction of flower beds at most cemeteries
- Memorial tree program
- Memorial bench program
- Monument restoration program
- Grounds beautification





Additional Cemetery Services

- Perform winter burials at all cemeteries
- 6 day a week service including holidays
- Full service mausoleum
- Interior niches (Civic)
- Exterior niches







Funding Challenges

 Revenue supports current operational requirement However, does not support all capital needs

 Shortfall of approximately \$ 300,000 per year to support capital needs



Reasons For Funding Pressures

- 16 cemeteries full (no revenue)
- 100 acres of grass to cut
- 4 miles of fencing and road
- 35,000 monuments
- Expansion needs (Waters, St.Johns...)
- Equipment replacement
- Mausoleum revenue not sustainable (\$300,000)



Funding Options for Capital Deficit

- Increase fees for existing services
- Tax levy support to fund the 16 full cemeteries.
 Surpluses from 9 active cemeteries will fund capital needs
- New Services



New Regulation

- In 2012 the Cemeteries Act was revised
- The new act is called The Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act (FBCSA)
- CGS cemetery by-laws are currently being amended to reflect the changes in legislation



New Regulation Key Highlights

- Requires Council to enter into an agreement with third parties (i.e funeral homes) to collect funds on the City's behalf
- Permits co-ownership and co-location of cemeteries and funeral establishments
 - funeral home can now own a cemetery and a crematorium
- Allow for free-standing crematoria
 - Crematorium can now be located off of cemetery lands
- Allow for a funeral establishment (funeral home or visitation center) on cemetery lands



Providing Credit for Families

- Currently families pay up front for all cemetery services
- Often families need time to collect CPP death benefit or life insurance
- Staff is recommending that families be allowed payment terms of 60 days
- Consistent with local funeral homes, other cemeteries



Memorial Bench Program

- Current bench ownership is allowed however the number of aging benches has become problematic
- Recognize the importance of benches to families at need
- Recommend continuance of program but 10 year lease rather then ownership
- Controls safety and maintenance of benches over the long term
- Existing benches grandfathered in
