Background

This report provides the projected financial results of the 2013 winter roads operations up to and including March 2013. The projected result for the month of March is a \$325,000 under expenditure as shown in Table 1. For the first three months of 2013 the result is a \$1.25 M over expenditure. Certain estimates were necessary to account for outstanding invoices.

March Winter Control Activities

As shown in Table 2 below, the City received approximately 20 centimetres or 51 percent of the average March snowfall. As a result there were no general callouts (city crews and contractors) during the month of March. The under expenditure for the month is largely attributable to sanding/salting/plowing as a result of the lower than average snowfall. Conversely, snow removal was over budget in March as larger than average snowfalls from December 2012 through February 2013 prompted snow removal for safety reasons at intersections and sight lines throughout the City.

Summary

In summary, winter roads operations for March 2013 resulted in an under expenditure of approximately \$325,000. For the first three months of 2013, winter control operations are over budget by approximately \$1.25 M. As per policy, any annual over expenditure in winter roads operations may be funded from the Roads Winter Control Reserve Fund.
