environment.






Greater Sudbury Source Protection Area

 - Whitefish River



- Area to which policy applies
- Timing implementation

Mail out to approximately 6,000 property owners in Ramsey Lake watershed and Community wells area

Draft Source Protection Plan

- Posted for public comment and review from April 16th to June 4th
- Open Houses held on May 15th and 16th in Sudbury and Hanmer
 >50 people attended
- Proposed Plan will be posted by GSSPA in July for final 30 day comment period
- Proposed Plan submitted to MOE by August 20th.



Application of commercial fertilizer (~3)	Municipal parks around Ramsey Lake, Idylwyde golf course, Deschene WHPA A
Handling and storage of commercial fertilizer and handling and storage of pesticide (1)	Phillipe WHPA B - garden centre
Application of road salt and snow storage (~12)	Approximately 17 properties, 12 property owners

Clean Water Act Mandated Implementation Responsibilities



- Greater Sudbury Source Protection Authority
 - Monitoring, annual reporting, management, support, updates
- City of Greater Sudbury
 - Policies implementing body
 - CWA Part IV functions <u>default</u> to municipality
 - Municipality <u>can</u> delegate Part IV enforcement to another public body (ie. Source Protection Authority)
- Other agencies/organizations
 - Policy implementing bodies





Potential Funding for Source Protection Implementation



- Provincial
- Municipal (implementing body; to GSSPA for mandated responsibilities- Provincial funding decision???
- Other Sources Part IV permit and inspection fees, development charges, water rates, general tax levy





GSSPA/CGS Implementation Meeting



- GSSPA request to transfer responsibility for Part IV
- Meeting with senior City staff; must prepare for implementation which is expected by early 2013
- GSSPA staff capacity, knowledge, expertise
- City-GSSPA negotiated agreement required to transfer Part IV function.





Final Thoughts



- August 20, 2012 is not the end; implementation begins soon
- GSSPA/NDCA sensitive to City financial pressures; pressing the Province for 100% funding
- GSSPA has capacity to implement Part IV responsibilities in cost-effective manner
- GSSPA and City will continue to work together to implement and monitor source protection planning for the safety and well-being of watershed residents who receive municipal drinking water supplies.
