Fire Services Regulating By-law

- **Background**

- Fire protection provincially mandated municipal responsibility
- Responsibility of municipal councils to be familiar with general fire protection requirements, practices, and procedures



Fire Services Regulating By-law

- **Core Services**

- Current by-law does not provide an accurate reflection of our core services:

- Prevention
 - Protection
 - Suppression

By-law Process (Draft)

- Revisions based on best practice
- Circulate for stakeholder input (OFM)
- Legal Services review of draft

Community Services Committee

- briefing of the framework for by-law development

By-law Approval

- return to standing Committee (April/May)
- Committee review and endorse final draft
- Recommend to Council for approval



Fire Services Regulating By-law

- **Mandate and Vision of the Fire Service**
 - Provide fire protection services & emergency response, public fire & life safety education, and fire prevention initiatives
 - Vision to be a well planned, well trained and well equipped emergency response agency



Fire Services Regulating By-law

- Primary Goals of the Fire Service
 - Provide appropriate public fire & life safety education and other fire prevention programs
 - Provide exceptional training to its members
 - Provide effective, timely and adequately staffed emergency response to CGS

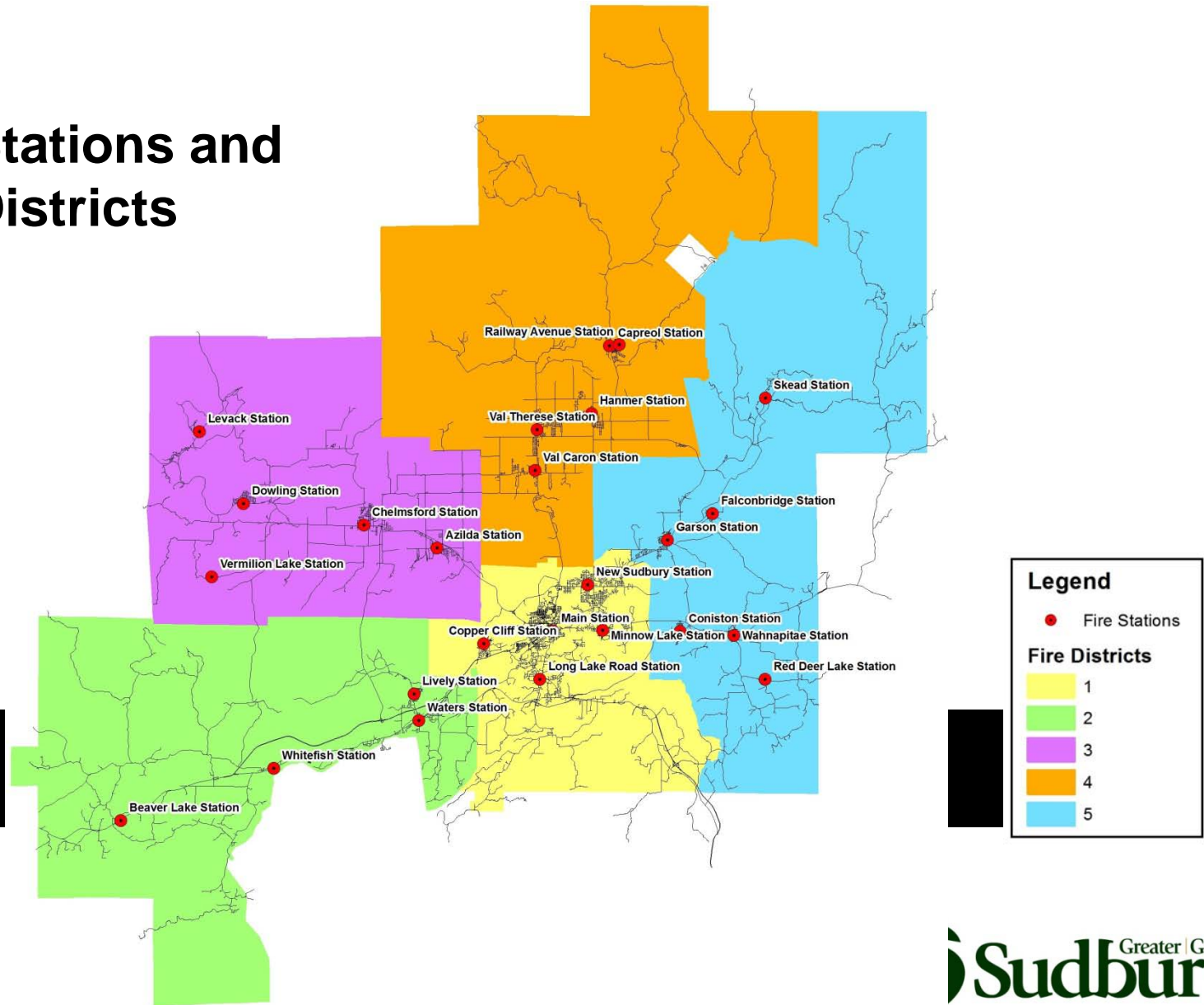

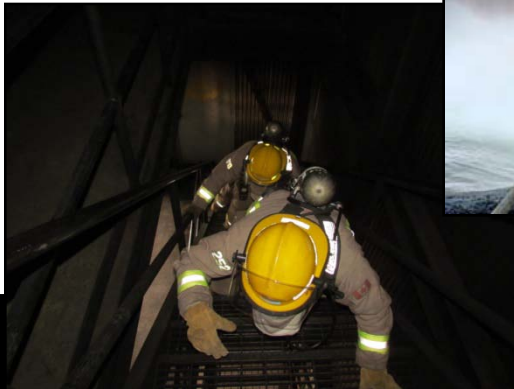

Fire Services Regulating By-law

- Intervention
 - Rescue
 - Low Angle, Aerial Ladder, Vehicle Extrication, Water (Shore Based), Water (Marine Unit), Ice, Swift Water

 - Medical (First Responder)

 - HAZMAT (Awareness Level)



Fire Services Regulating By-law

- **Prevention**

- Inspection
- Fire Regulation Enforcement
- Investigation
- Public Fire Extinguisher Training
- Permitting (Fire Regulation Only)
- Youth Arson Prevention
- Public Awareness & Education



Fire Services Regulating By-law

- Fire Services NOT provided
 - No trench rescue
 - No confined space rescue
 - Limited HAZMAT response
 - No high angle rescue

- Legal Services review completed
- Departmental review

Community Services Committee

- Review the final by-law (April/May)

By-law Approval

- Committee endorse final draft
- Recommendation to Council for approval
