Housing ServicesBudget Highlights

- Gross proposed budget \$28.5M, net \$18.7M
- Subsidies for 45 providers
- Over 4,500 units







Housing ServicesAccomplishments

- Over 650 households housed through the Housing Registry
- Delivery of the Canada-Ontario Affordable Housing Program
 - Affordable units completed or under construction (\$5.2M, 148 units)
 - Social Housing Repair and Retrofit Program and Renewable Energy Retrofit Program (\$2.3M, 26 projects renovated)
 - o Home Repair Program (\$107,000, 11 loans given)
 - o Housing Allowance Program (\$92,000, 35 units)



Social Services - Budget Highlights

- Gross proposed budget \$43.7M, net \$10M
- 1% benefit rate increase (historically 2%)
- Caseload projection 3,475

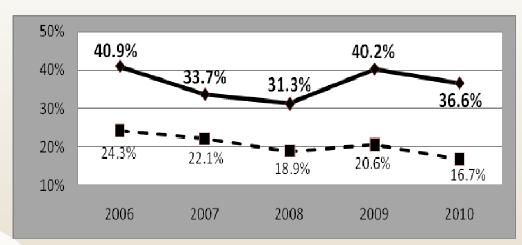

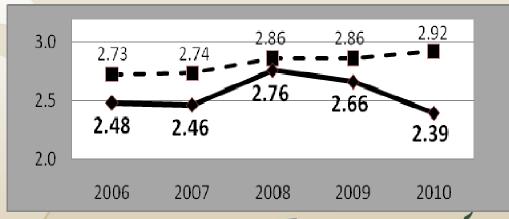


OMBI Performance Measures

Number of Nursing Staffed Hours per LTC Bed Day

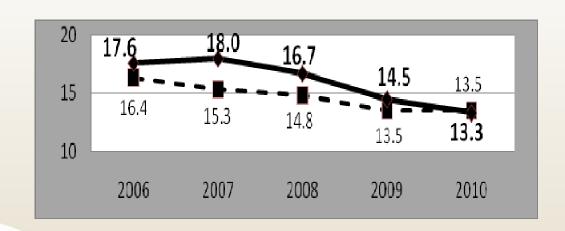

Net Municipal Operating Cost per Emergency Shelter Bed Night



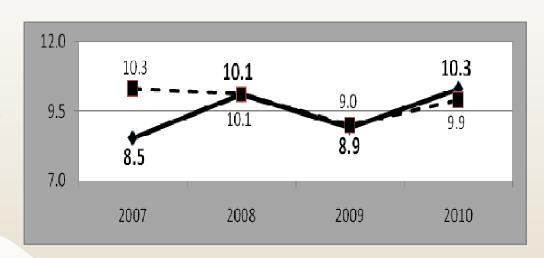
