Chief of Emergency Services Office

- Budget Highlights
- 2011 Chief of Emergency Services Office Budget
 - Salaries and Benefits increase 8.9% (\$46,513)
 - \$8,300 due to contractual obligations under CBA
 - \$38,000 due to implementation of a part-time Data Integration Specialist which was off-set by reductions in operating line accounts under EMS



- Budget Highlights
- 2011 Emergency Management Budget
 - Increase: 2.9% (\$16,728)
 - Salaries and Benefits increase 2.6% (\$4,125) due to contractual obligations under CBA
 - An addition of \$10,000 in provision to reserves relates to the Corporate redistribution of existing Capital Envelopes.

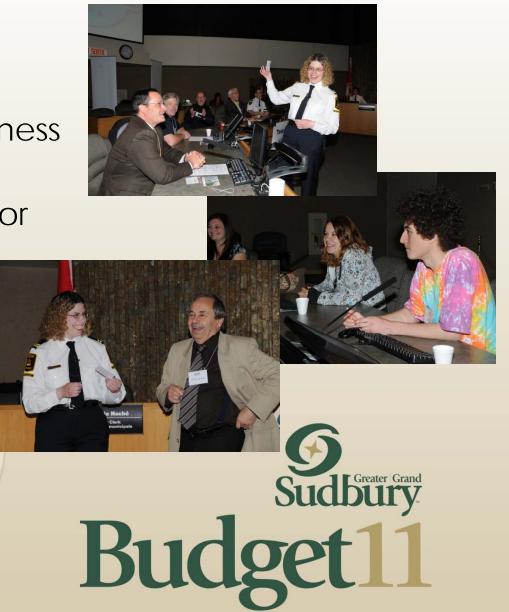

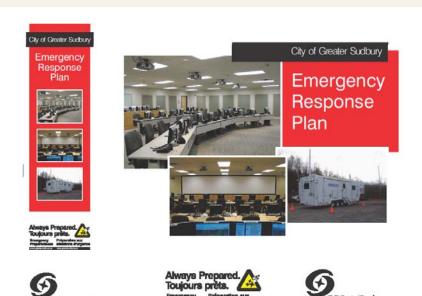

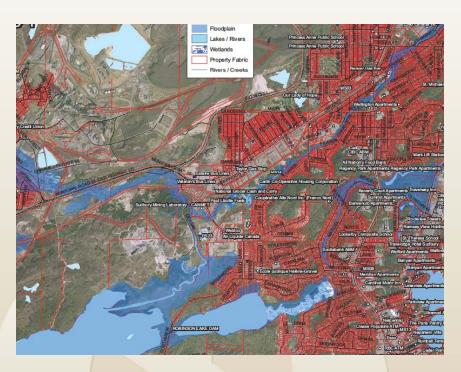

- Budget Highlights
- 2011 Lionel E. Lalonde Centre (CLELC)
 - Decrease: 10.5% (\$31,945)
- 2011 projected revenue is 250,000





Lionel E. Lalonde Centre

- Accomplishments
- Continue to promote the Centre as a first class training & meeting facility
- Continue to support "green initiatives" such as lighting, recycling and replacement of older less energy efficient equipment in order to reduce our carbon foot print.



- Budget Highlights
- 2011 Emergency Medical Services
 - Increase: 5.0% (\$419,488)
 - Salaries and Benefits increase 2.9% (\$378,168) due to contractual obligations under CBA
 - A decrease of \$41,000 in purchased contract services was identified to off-set the costs of the part-time Data Integration Specialist position as indicated under the Chief of Emergency Services' Office
 - The Provincial Grant increased by \$88,000 based on prior years' announcements from the Provincial government (projection only)

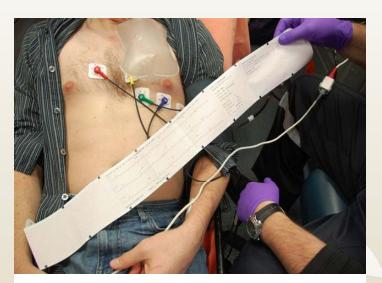
- Accomplishments



- CPAP (Continuous Positive Airway Pressure) pressurizes the lungs to keep them moving with every breath

 Vehicle Operator Improvement Program consists of three (3) phases focused on defensive driving for collision avoidance (classroom, practical, and simulation)

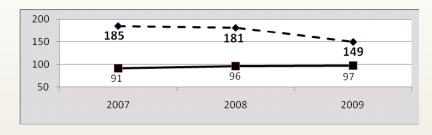

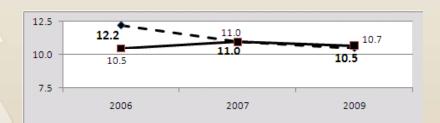
Total EMS Responses per 1,000 Population
