 Increase employment, economic activity and investment in the City.



Background

- A community improvement plan has existed in downtown Sudbury since 1987.
- In 2003 and 2007 the CIP was augmented to include a number of financial programs and incentives to stimulate redevelopment and rehabilitation in the area.



Two rounds of competitions in 2008 & 09.

19 applications received, majority were recommended by GSDC and approved by Council.


Projects eligible for up to \$93,870 in grants from the City, levering approx \$235,500 in private investment.

Expanding CIP Programs toTown Centres

- Initially, Town Centres as defined in the Official Plan and outlined in the DC By-law would be the focus of the new CIP, along with the Flour Mill Business Improvement Area.
- CIP process would include a comprehensive review of the potential areas to determine the best approach for maximum results.
- Staff would bring forward recommendations to include and/or exclude some areas based on the analysis.
