
How Many Patients Are Seen? 2008/09


Types By Care Delivered



Impact of telemedicine on clinical practice (2008 data)




"I will actively promote telemedicine services in our community and be a resource to develop new areas of clinical consultation. My experience has been that the service provided by the Network has no limits."

97% were satisfied with their telemedicine visit.
