
Onaping Falls Community Action Network is one of two CANS in Ward 3.

Far enough away from the stacks to allow the continued growth of forest on the many hillsides.










The former Onaping Falls was an amalgamation of three individual communities.








Mayor Rodrigues suggested changes to the building which should be put on the city's wish list.

CAN is Extremely Important, Because They Represent Hope, says Mayor

Sudbury Mayor John Rodriguez told the representatives of the 12 Community Action Networks that attended the CAN Summit December 5 that the work of CAN is extremely important, because they represent hope.

"Being the mayor of the City of Greater Sudbury I have the opportunity to see that this is the largest geographic city in the province of Ontario. It is the second largest in Canada and the fourth largest in North America.

"We have over 3600 km of roads and lanes, which if stretched endto-end would go from here to Atlanta Georgia. We are as big as the state of Rhode Island, three quarters the size of Prince Edward Island.

"So we have challenges. City Council can't make the city work alone. We have great staff, and I am always amazed at the services they are able to deliver in an effective and timely fashion with the kind of money we get."

The name of your organization is CAN the Community Action Network.

"The C in CAN is for community. Community involves citizens. As mayor and councillors we cannot do what you do. You're at the front lines. You are interacting, making things happen in the community, because you believe this can be the greatest city in Canada. We all believe that.
