



 - Developed goals, developed principles and values, identified critical issues
- Inaugural Meeting held May 31st, 2007

- Community Directory
 - Circulated to every business and household in the area
 - Includes listing of local businesses, organizations, schools, etc.
 - Also used to promote City services such as recycling, 311



- Beautification & Clean Up
 - Participated in City's annual Clean Up Blitz
 - Repainting and refurbishment of local playground equipment, gazebos and trails
 - Working with By-Law to improve abandoned properties
 - Worked with Waste Management to identify areas for new garbage receptacles
 - Engaged CN & CPR to participate in cleanup blitz
 - Gathered 30 tonnes of waste





- Guest Speakers
 - Each meeting features a guest speaker to inform the community about services and programs available to them
 - Speakers to date include EarthCare Sudbury, COPS program, Canadian Cancer Society, Greater Sudbury Police Services, Pet Save, Re-Store Habitat for Humanity, CPR
 - City staff and departments have also made presentations (Waste Management, By-Law)
 - Greater Sudbury Police Services representative attends every meeting



- School Partnerships
 - Presentations made to St. David and Lansdowne schools encouraging them to recycle and take pride in their community
 - Students participated in annual Clean Up Blitz
 - Gathered input from students regarding their ideas for the community







- Business Partnerships
 - Reaching out to existing local businesses
 - Meetings are used as an opportunity to introduce new businesses owners to the community

Clean-Up Committee

- Organizes clean-up blitz events and participates with city wide sponsored clean-ups
- Improve local parks and playgrounds by addressing graffiti, litter, re-painting, etc.
- Develop programs such as 'Adopta-Lane' or 'Adopt-a-Park'
- Identify areas where illegal dumping occurs and report to City
- Identify properties not meeting property standards and report





Communications Committee

- Promote meetings and events with local media
- Develop and maintain website
- Circulate flyers through local community
- Develop CAN newsletters





Roads & Sidewalks Committee

- Monitor roadway and sidewalk problems
- Monitor snowplowing issues
- Research City plans for roadways, sidewalks and infrastructure
- Look at parking issues
- Report problems to City





Historical Committee

- Suggest local buildings and areas that are historically significant
- Design pamphlets, signage, plaques for sites
- Research historical or significant families or individuals from the area
- Research, document and promote local history



School Committee

- Develop partnerships with local schools
- Educate students on importance of a clean and safe community and their responsibilities
- Involve students in local community initiatives
- Bring students in as active participants in the decision making process





Victory Playground Committee

 Work and consult with Myths and Mirrors, parents and youth to develop and improve Victory Playground site







Property Standards Committee

- Identify buildings and dwellings that are unsafe and/or require cleaning up
- Identify properties that are no longer occupied
- Offer help from the CAN to those property owners or tenants who may require assistance in cleaning up properties
- Obtain information on current property by-laws and ensure that they are enforced
