



Rayside Balfour Museum

- Established in 1998 at the Lionel E. Lalonde Centre in Azilda
- Community raised \$20,000 (which currently sits in a City reserve fund)
- Depicts origins of logging and agriculture life from the Chelmsford and Azilda area
- Relocated in 2005 to the Chelmsford Library





Rayside Balfour Museum Challenges

- Very little exhibit area or artifact storage space
- The move to the Chelmsford CSC was viewed as temporary until a suitable location in Azilda could be found


Opportunity – Azilda Fire Hall

• Vacated by fire department as a result of relocating to the Lionel E. Lalonde Centre



Azilda Fire Hall

- At 3,500 sq.ft., has ample space to house both the library and museum
- Ideal location in Azilda
 - o On the main artery (St. Agnes St.)
 - Part of a 12 acre development that includes the Dr. Edgar Leclair Arena and the Rick MacDonald Memorial Park
 - Adjacent to a Seniors Complex and Youth Centre





Azilda Fire Hall Challenges

- Retrofitting a building built in the 1950's
- Estimated retrofit cost of \$500,000



Financial Plan - \$500,000

- Community Development Capital Envelope -\$300,000
- Sale of existing library property \$130,000
- Councillor Dutrisac one time budget request to support project - \$50,000
- Rayside Balfour Museum Reserve Fund \$20,000
