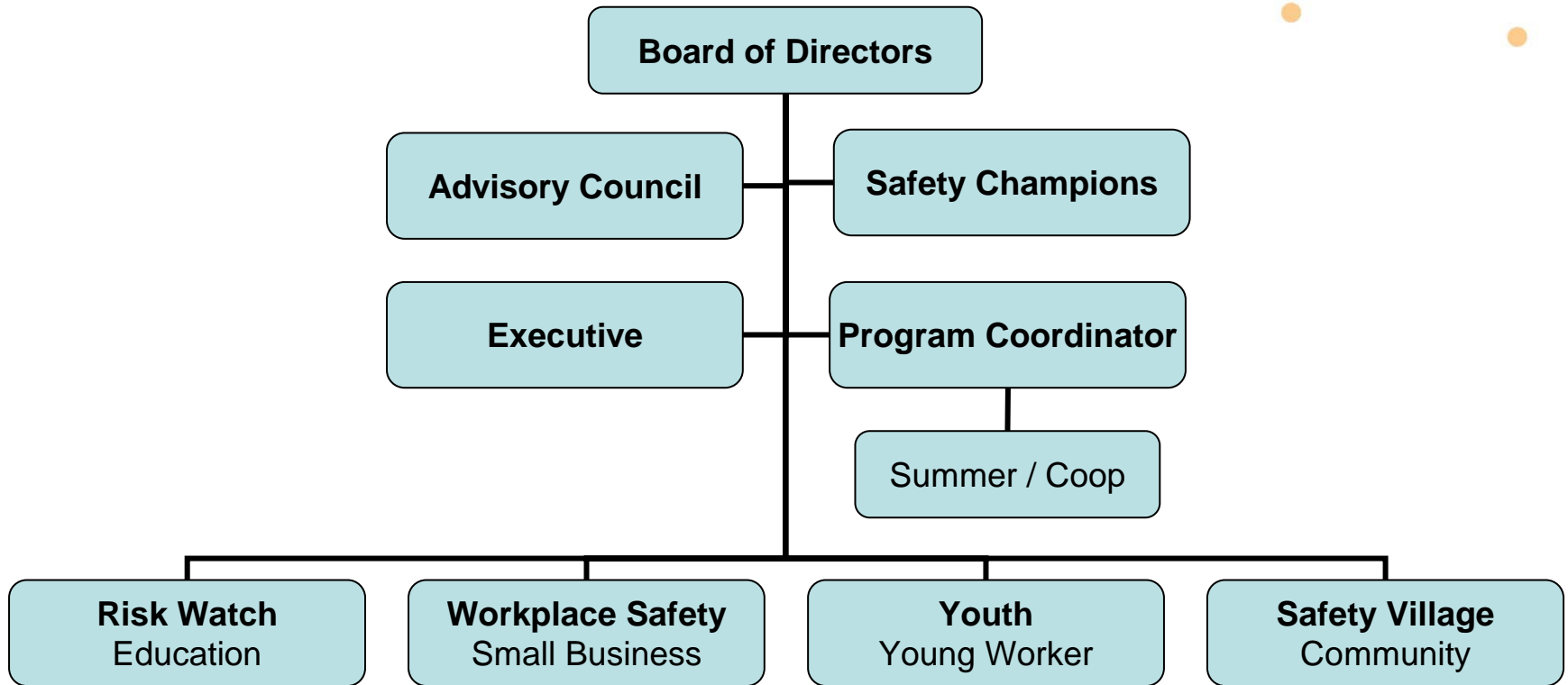
Safe Communities Canada
