# **Report Summary**

### **Background**

As outlined in the report regarding the appointment of citizens to Advisory Panels that was presented at the Nominating Committee meeting on February 5, 2019, the deadline to apply for the following Advisory Panels was extended to Friday, February 1, 2019 at 4:30 p.m.:

- Population Health Safety and Well Being Advisory Panel (one (1) individual representing custodial services providers to children or youth)
- Public Art Advisory Panel
- Solid Waste Advisory Panel
- Watershed Advisory Panel

Application forms were available on the city's website, at any Citizen Service Centre or Library location, or by calling 705-674-4455, extension 4209. In addition, the Communications Department issued two (2) PSAs advertising the extension. A sufficient number of completed application forms have now been received to fill the vacant positions. Citizens who had already submitted an application to sit on the above noted Panels were not required to apply again.

# **Public Art Advisory Panel**
