

2020 PRIORITIES

Priorities need to be strategic. The human costs need to be measured with the economic costs. This is urgent not only in the core but also in the smaller urban areas of the City of Greater Sudbury.

Priority #1: Off-street, 24-hour housing and basic necessity supply.

- Washrooms, laundry, clothing, food, security
- Resident housekeeping requirement
- Lethal weapons prohibited
- Curfew

Priority #2: Drug Control

- All needles must be used and returned to a the safe injection site
- All drugs ingested or injected, subject to random quality checks

Priority #3: Activities to improve life skills

- Need for consistent daily schedules (breakfast, lunch, supper)
- Outdoor activities
- Encouragement for upgrading life skills
- Community work with union support street cleaning, etc.
- All work compensated at a fair rate

A SOLUTION PROPOSAL

A solution will require a community-wide effort FOR EXAMPLE:

Due to the current pandemic, Laurentian University, has a large number of residence rooms that will remain unoccupied for the 2020/21 year. These rooms and included facilities are uniquely suitable for housing most of the City of Greater Sudbury homeless population during that time period. The facilities can address all of the three priorities.

ON-CAMPUS STUDY GROUP

Action is needed NOW to initiate talks with the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Health and Laurentian University to explore partnering with the University for the 2020/21 winter season.

Tomorrow's Hope stands ready and willing to assist in the establishing of the facility, aiding in operating the facility and working with the homeless to ensure the facility is seen to be a positive step forward and to use those facilities to improve their lives.

We are witness to social and economic foundational transition. Homeless is but one of the issues requiring timely attention because of the human cost.
