Edible Forest Gardens (food forests)

*Fruit trees and other perennial edibles

*Lower maintenance; water savings so far = +200,000 litres per year

*Halfway to goal of one in each ward by 2023



Youth Employment in Agriculture (YEA)

***August 2019: Received one-year grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation to develop a YEA program**

***Enabled hiring of Youth Program Coordinator, summer students, interns**

***Addresses gaps:**

– majority of farmers at or near retirement age with no succession plan

–Ontario relies on 20,000 migrant workers to grow our food
