At the City Council meeting of August 12, 2020 Councillor Lapierre submitted a petition to the City Clerk requesting that AIM Recycling located on Kenneth Drive be relocated to an industrial park.

Aim Recycling has gained a strong foothold on Kenneth Dr. We were never consulted, nor aware of any studies done to allow this american iron metal company to operate in our area. They are mostly crushing vehicles containing some gas, oil, and acid. The liquids seep in our water table next to the municipal water station.

Six days a week, the crushing never stops, producing a high level of noise.

Another concern is certainly the high volume of traffic this enterprise has created. On a daily basis, we witness countless transports in addition to all the trailers full of scrap metals.

Kenneth Dr. does not have sidewalks. The children are no longer safe to ride their bicycles, and neither are the pedestrians.

We strongly recommend that this company be relocated in an industrial park away from our farmland and neighbourhood.
