PETITION

We the residents of Ward 12, Montrose ave, the Villages of Montrose, of the Greater City of Sudbury are requesting reclassification of the north end of Montrose ave that is beyond the intersection of Forestdale and Thornecliffe. The reason for reclassification is to improve frequency of snowplowing, salting, and sanding services as this area is now populated. This section was undeveloped land until recent years and was classified as a 4-6 local road. However, this land is now occupied by a Dalron development that includes 5 homes and a condominium development of approximately 40 units. These families require access to the rest of regularly plowed Montrose for work, children who walk on the street to access school bus routes, mail and parcel delivery. The condominium unit alone has approximately 44 vehicles, plus the 5 individual homes on this stretch.

Also, this end of Montrose requiring plowing is only approximately 1000 feet long. It is more cost effective to have the last bit plowed while the rest of Montrose is being done than for it to return later for such a small stretch.

Lastly, the end of Montrose can be used as a snow storage area for city staff and a convenient turn around for the plow operators.

For these reasons we request reclassification from class 4-6 local road to class 3 major road
