

## Cost Recovery

- Based on user-pay principle
- Plan Review and Regulations functions should be low burden to taxpayers
- currently ~ 28%
- Our fees were 50-95% too low


### Levy Comparators

- 2019 increase to \$5.82



#### Floodplain Mapping 2018-20




#### 30 Year Capital Expenditure Profile


