

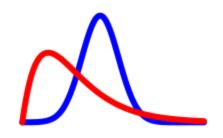
# The City of Greater Sudbury: An Age Friendly Community in the Making

 For the first time in Canadian history there are more older adults than youth

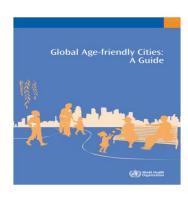
 29,665 People aged 65 and over live within the City out of a total of 161,531 making 18.4% of our population
